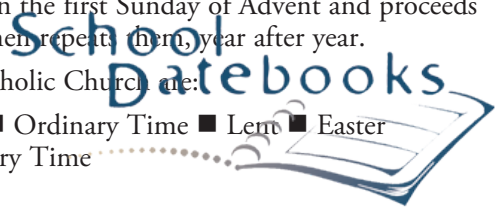
The liturgical year connects us to both our faith and to each other with meaningful traditions.

The seasons of the Catholic Church are:

- Advent ■ Christmas ■ Ordinary Time ■ Lent ■ Easter
- Pentecost ■ Ordinary Time
