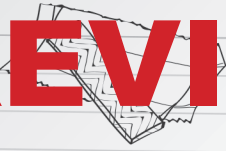
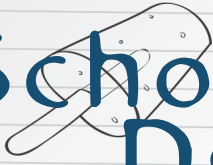

Even-year-old Frank Epperson found his cup of powdered soda, water, and stir stick frozen after leaving it outside.



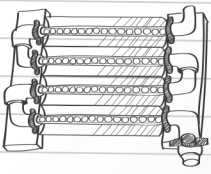
Trampoline (1930)
